ASCSA SUMMER SESSION

DEADLINE: January 9, 2023

The Summer Session program of the American School of Classical Studies at Athens is a sixweek travel study course designed for those who wish to become acquainted with Greece and its major monuments, and to improve their understanding of the country's landscape, history, material culture, and literature from antiquity to the present.

The 2023 Summer Session runs from June 12 to July 26, 2023, and its Director is Professor Glenn R. Bugh of Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University.

Format: The ASCSA Summer Session has provided extensive exposure to Greece, ancient and modern, for generations of students of Classics and related fields. It has a strong academic component with participants researching and presenting topics on site and offers unique opportunities to interact with eminent archaeologists in the field. Roughly half of the session is spent in travel throughout Greece. Three trips give participants an introduction to the major archaeological sites and museum collections throughout the country. The remainder of the session is devoted to study of the museums and monuments of Athens and the surrounding area with day trips to such sites as Marathon, Sounion, and Eleusis. The Summer Session's commitment to presenting a comprehensive view of Greece's rich history and archaeology leads to long days and extensive walking in the hot Mediterranean summer. Participants must be able to cover very uneven, rocky terrain and endure temperatures well above 30°C for extended periods.

Eligibility: Enrollment is open to graduate and advanced undergraduate students, and to high school teachers and college/university faculty of classics and related subjects. Enrollment is limited to twenty participants. The language of instruction is English.

<u>Cost:</u> The fee for the 2023 program is \$4,900. This includes tuition, room for the entire six-week period, partial board in Athens, travel within Greece, and museum and site entry fees. International airfare, most meals outside Athens, and incidental expenses are the participant's responsibility. Financial aid is available in the form of ASCSA scholarships, awarded on the basis of academic merit. Many classical professional organizations have funding opportunities. Application: Applicants will complete an online application, including scans of academic transcripts (unofficial transcripts are acceptable), and arrange for the online submission of two letters of recommendation by the application deadline, January 9, 2023.
