Art History and You: What, Why, and How
Artist talk and conversation with

Loren Munk

at ARTS @ 29 Garden

Join Brooklyn-based artist, video blogger, and NYC art historian Loren Munk for a conversation about your role in art history.

Since he was arrested in the 1980s for graffiti tagging, Munk has been making waves in the New York art scene. With his ear close to the ground, Munk paints vibrant, painstakingly accurate charts and maps tracing art movements, galleries, and communities that reflect New York's unique position at the intersection of local and international art. Alongside his project of aestheticized art history, Munk has become notorious in the city's art scene for the Kalm Report, a video blog that lets viewers around the world wander virtually through New York galleries and museums.

Munk will speak on how creative communicators of all kinds can break down the walls of art history, activating lateral connections and building dynamic communities. Drawing on his immense, direct knowledge of NYC's art scene over the past few decades, he will address ways—both theoretical and practical—of complicating the linear narrative of art history as a parade of 'great' figures and movements. His talk will be followed by conversation and Q&A.
